 YEAR
- WE ALSO MANAGE OTHER PROJECTS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH MRC AND UKWANDA.
- DONATIONS, BEQUESTS AND "STOEP SALES" WE CALL THIS OUR BREAD AND BUTTER MONEY BUT IF WE WANT TO PUT JAM ON THE BREAD WE NEED TO RAISE OUR OWN FUNDS.

- LIMITED RESOURCES/STOCK TO PROVIDE QUALITY CARE

- CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT OF OUR FACILITIES






